OBA PE Kit Options

- It is not compulsory to buy all items
- Students may wear shorts or socks if preferred to wearing a tracksuit
- OBA branded polo shirt is compulsory for all.
- Socks are only compulsory if wearing shorts.
- A choice of shorts/leggings/ tracksuit bottoms. Any plain black leggings or tracksuit bottoms from any shop can be worn. Logo only allowed if cannot be seen – i.e. polo shirt will cover.
- OBA branded hoodie is optional. However, if a warm top is to be worn, it must be the branded hoodie.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

We know that right now, you are probably feeling a mix of nerves and excitement about starting at the academy. Don't worry – so is everyone else! We know that you will have a lot of questions about your new school so we have answered some of the ones we get asked a lot here.

What will happen if I get lost?

During your first few days in Year 7 there will be lots of people in the corridors helping you to your lessons but if you get stuck, just speak to a member of staff or an older student and they will take you to where you need to be.

Will I get into trouble if I am late for my lesson?

Your teachers know that it will take you a bit of time to get used to the academy and they will understand if you are a little late whilst you are finding your way around in the first week.

Is it true that you get your head flushed down the toilet?

No, definitely not! This is a rumour that has been going around for years and if you ask any member of staff or any of the older students, they will tell you it has never happened!

I am worried about being bullied. What will happen if I am?

Bullying of any kind is NOT acceptable at the academy. If you feel worried or upset about the way that someone is treating you then it is really important to tell someone. In school, there are lots of people you can talk to. i.e. your Form Tutor, Head of Year, Pastoral Manager, a teacher or any other member of staff that you feel confident talking to. As soon as we know about a problem, we can help you to deal with it.

When can I go to the toilet?

Students are encouraged to go to the toilet at break and lunch time rather than lesson time (unless they have a medical pass) so that learning time is interrupted as little as possible.

What food options are there?

Students who arrive in school before 8.15am are allowed a free breakfast. Breakfast includes cereal, toast, fruit, bacon, sausages and hot drinks.

At break time you can buy toast, cheese-on-toast, bacon and egg muffins, bagels, bacon barms and fruit juice.

The canteen is split into different serving areas and at lunch time these areas all serve different types of food.

Lunch options include; Roast Dinners, Spaghetti Bolognese, Noodles, Curry and Rice, Pasta, Chicken Wraps, Pizza, Jacket Potatoes, Salads, Sandwiches, Panini's, Fruit, Yoghurts and a tasty selection of homemade cakes!

How do I pay for my snack/ lunch?

Parents/Carers add money to your online school lunch account. You will

have your fingerprint taken during your first week at school and then use your fingerprint to pay for any food/drink you buy in the canteen.

How many lessons do we have per day?

5 lessons per day. You will also have a form period each morning.

How long is each lesson?

Each lesson is 1 hour long.

How many break times are there?

There are 2 break times. 20 minutes in the morning for break and 30 minutes for lunch.

How many people will be in my class?

Approximately 25 people.

How many people will be in Year 7?

180 people!

Will I still see my friends from primary school?

Yes, if you are coming from a primary school where some of your friends are also coming from then we will try our best to place you in a form with someone you know. Some of these friends might also be in your lessons, but either way you will still be able to meet up with them at break and lunchtime.

I do not know anyone who goes to Bolingbroke Academy – Will I make new friends?

Yes - making new friends is one of the most exciting things about starting high school! There are lots of opportunities to make new friends as you will be with different people in your lessons, PE groups and after school clubs. Try to remember that there will be lots of other people just like you who feel shy and nervous and they will all want to make new friends as well!

Are the teachers nice?

Yes! All the teachers at OBA are really nice, friendly and helpful. They are here to support you and help you to succeed. All your teachers

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will ask of you, is that you try hard and do your best.

How many different teachers will I have?

Approximately 12 – you will have a different teacher for each of your subjects.

What is a Form Tutor?

A Form Tutor is the person who registers you in the morning. They monitor your attendance and punctuality, read with you and make sure you are set up for the day ahead. You will have the same form tutor throughout your time at the academy so they will get to know you really well. You can talk to your form tutor about any worries or problems you may have.

What is a Pastoral Manager?

A pastoral manager works with your Form Tutor and Head of Year to help with any day to day support you may need.

What is a Head of Year?

Every year group has a Head of Year. This person will stay with you as your Head of Year until you reach Year 11. They look after all the day to day issues concerning students in their year group. They provide support as well as being responsible for monitoring students attendance, punctuality and behavior. The Head of Year 7 2021 is Miss McKevitt and she is really excited to meet you!

If I am late for school – will I get a detention?

Punctuality is a very important part of life at OBA and if you are late without a valid reason then you will receive a consequence (i.e. a detention at lunch time or at the end of the day). It is really important that you arrive in school for 8.30am every day because when you are late you miss important learning time. Form time sets you up for the rest of the day and if you are late you might miss vital information you need to know.

Will I get lots of homework?

Homework is spaced out throughout the week so that you have enough time to do it. Your homework is an important part of your learning and therefore it is important that it is completed properly and on time.

Are there any after school clubs?

Yes, there are lots! After school clubs at OBA are called 'Enrichment' and they run after school between

3.00pm and 4.00pm. Enrichment activities include; football, netball, rowing, drama, music, dance, cooking, science, chess, fitness and archeology.

Will we have assemblies?

Yes, you will have an assembly every week with everyone else in Year 7. Year group assemblies give important messages about key topics. You will also have an assembly every half term with everyone else in your house. House assemblies are linked to competitions!

What if I am feeling shy and nervous?

Don't Worry!

It is completely normal to feel shy and nervous as everything is new to you. Just remember that everyone else is feeling the same way as you, even if they are not saying so! Hopefully the comments and stories you have read in this booklet from our current year 7 students show you that you have nothing to worry about!
