






Welcome

The Ormiston Bolingbroke Curriculum

We have designed a curriculum to dare our students to shine – to be courageous and to make positive choices that lead to a happy and healthy future. We deliver our curriculum over a one-week cycle. There are 25 lessons per week with 5 lessons and one tutorial period each day. Throughout Key Stage 3 pupils are separated into two broadly equal bands, 'O' and 'B'. Students are set by prior attainment in mathematics, languages and science and in more mixed groups for humanities, physical education and the creative curriculum.

On average we have 26 students per class.

In Years 7, 8 and 9 students study a curriculum of:

- English (5 lessons)
- Mathematics (5 lessons)
- Science (3 lessons)
- Physical Education (P.E.) (1 lesson)
- Geography (1 lesson)
- History (1 lesson)
- Spanish/French (2 lessons)
- Design and Technology (1 lesson)
- Computing and Business (1 lesson)
- Music (1 lesson)
- Art (1 lesson)

- Drama (1 lesson)
- Philosophy and Religious Education (1 lesson)

In Year 10 and 11, students choose a personalised curriculum and are placed into two bands of mixed prior attainment, O and B. The banding is used to increase timetabling flexibility to allow the greatest choice of qualification options delivered by subject specialists.

In Year 10 and Year 11, all students study a core curriculum of:

- English Literature and English Language (5 lessons)
- Mathematics (5 lessons)
- Combined Science (Inc. modules in Biology, Chemistry and Physics) (5 lessons)
- P.E. (Core P.E. is based around essential health and fitness and does not lead to a qualification) (1 lesson.)
- PSHE and Careers (delivered through tutor time and bespoke events.)

Students personalise their remaining curriculum time by selecting further optional qualifications to study at Key Stage 4. We do not limit the curriculum choices for any of our students. All students receive guidance and are able to freely choose to study all available subjects including the English Baccalaureate (EBacc), which is achieved by completing qualification in English, Mathematics, Science, History/Geography and Spanish. Other options such as Separate Science GCSEs in Biology, Chemistry and Physics are also open to all regardless of prior attainment.

In Year 12 and 13, we continue to offer a wide range of qualifications that allow our students to progress from their studies at Key Stage 4. There is a comprehensive range of academic A-Levels on offer and a variety of vocational BTEC qualifications as well as opportunity to resit essential qualifications in Mathematics and English. We deliver our personal development and wellbeing curriculum to all years through tutor periods, assemblies and one-off events.

We offer extensive extracurricular enrichment each day in which students have the opportunity to engage with academic intervention and support, and to participate in a wide variety of clubs and groups.

The House System

At Ormiston Bolingbroke Academy we pride ourselves on our strong pastoral care. We have a two-pronged approach using our house system to run alongside our bespoke year group format.

In 2020 we re-vamped our house system, moving from the traditional five writers we have used since opening in 2010, to four brand new houses based around the night sky. Constellations was chosen following a competition amongst our students and was decided upon due to their links with our motto 'Lucere Aude' – Dare to Shine. Each House has two forms from each year group, the house system runs from Year 7 all the way through to the end of Year 13 and students will remain with their house for their entire school life. There is a full programme of inter-house events and competitions throughout the school year involving all of our faculties, for example our math's magicians, spelling bees, public speaking and sports day to name a few. Below is a more in-depth look at each House.

To shine is to be the best version of yourself, to have the knowledge and skills that empower you with luminous confidence. Stars shine every night. They are beautiful on their own but are even more powerful within a constellation. By working together, they have guided generations of travellers for as long as humans have walked the Earth.

Name - DRACO (The Dragon) Colour - RED Head of House - MISS PORSCHKE



DRACO (pronounced DRAY-co) is large but faint constellation always present in the UK Sky - we call this type of constellation circumpolar as they can be found circling around the North Pole. The tail of the dragon wraps around Ursa Minor (the little dipper) and Polaris - the North Star.

Mythology

Ancient Egyptians identified it as a goddess with the body of a crocodile. In Greek mythology the constellation represents many different dragons. Often said to be ever-vigilant fitting it's circumpolar nature. In one legend the constellation represents Tiamat, an ancient Titan who transformed herself into a dragon in a battle against the Greek gods of Olympus. In the battle Tiamat was defeated by Athena and flung into the heavens above.

Name – PEGASUS (The Winged Horse) Colour – BLUE Head of House – MR WYNNE



Pegasus (pronounced PEG-u-sus) can be found in the Autumn/ Winter night sky, It can be located by searching for the faint but large "Great Square of Pegasus". Pegasus is used by astronomers to locate the Andromeda Galaxy - our closest neighbouring galaxy and the source of the oldest and faintest light visible to the naked eye.

Mythology

In Greek mythology Pegasus was the son of Poseidon and Medusa. Poseidon the God of the sea and horses seduced Medusa, a mortal, in the Temple of Athena. As a punishment Athena covered Medusa's body in scales and turned her hair into snakes! Anyone mortal who looked at Medusa turned to stone. The hero Perseus slew Medusa and Pegasus sprang from her blood up into the heavens where the winged horse carried Zeus' lightning bolts.

Name – URSA (The Bear) Colour – YELLOW Head of House – MR OAKES



Ursa (pronounced ER-suh) are two constellations in the night sky. Ursa Major and Ursa Minor are visible throughout the year in the UK. It is a circumpolar constellation that contains Polaris - the North Star - which is approximately above the North Pole and remains relatively still and ever present and is so useful for navigation. Ursa Major the large constellation contains the asterism - recognisable shape - of the plough. The bucket of the plough points to Polaris in the constellation Ursa Minor.

Mythology

The Great Bear may be the oldest constellation, dating back to a Paleolithic bear cult 50,000 years ago. In Greek mythology, Ursa Major is identified with Callisto, a renowned huntress who was transformed into a bear by Zeus' wife Hera.

Name – ORION (The Hunter) Colour – GREEN Head of House – MRS FITZGERALD



Orion (pronounced oh-RYE-un) is one of the most easily identifiable constellations. Orion is one of the few constellations that is visible from everywhere on Earth. It is visible in the UK in the winter months from October through to April by looking south. Orion contains more bright stars than any other constellation and it also contains the sky's brightest stellar nebular - the birthplace of new stars - located just below "Orion's Belt" on the celestial equator.

Mythology

Although there is no central account of Orion's life in Greek mythology, stories about Orion are woven into many Greek legends. In one myth, Orion boasted that he was such a great hunter that he was a match for any beast. The goddess Hera decided to teach him a lesson and sent a tiny scorpion (Scorpio) to sting him. Orion crushed the scorpion, but only after he was fatally stung. The pair were both placed in the sky as a reminder of the cost of hubris. Canis Major and Minor - to other prominent constellations - are said to be Orions hunting dogs, while Taurus - another constellation - is said to be his quarry.
