Academy Welcomes 300 New Students to the OBA Family



OBA is extremely impressed with the excellent start made by its two newest cohorts.

Students in Year 7 joined the academy on Thursday 2nd
September 2021 along with their parents/carers and started the day with a welcome breakfast and induction ceremony led by Mrs Evans. Ties were presented as part of the assembly and whilst children were excited to find out which 'house' they had been placed in, form tutors were equally delighted to announce their smartly dressed tutees to the rest of the year group.

Year 7 students were the only year group in the academy on Thursday 2nd September 2021 and were joined only by Year 12 on Friday 3rd September 2021. This enabled staff to engage in two full days of induction with Year 7 to ensure that they still experienced the full transition programme they would

have had in July, had their visit days been able to go ahead as planned.

Mrs Snagg, responsible for transition, said; "We are very aware that as a result of the pandemic, our new students have not had a full year of school since Year 4. It was therefore imperative to us that our Year 7 cohort had a comprehensive and settled start to their high school journey."

Year 6 students were invited to attend Saturday Academy sessions in their class bubbles to help familiarise them with the academy, and induction appointments were replaced with virtual meetings with form tutors. Students identified as requiring additional support were invited in for socially distanced tours around the academy and the whole year group was encouraged to attend a week long summer school in August.

Out of a cohort of 180 students, over 135 students attended summer school with over 120 students attending every day. Students worked with specialist Maths and English teachers in



the morning before having lunch together and then had a choice of recreational activities in the afternoon. Options included, a climbing wall, trampolining, science, cooking, retro-sports, football, cricket, dance, drama and even an archaeology dig. The week culminated in a trip to 'Tenpin Bowl' in Warrington where 120 students enjoyed 2 games of bowling and lunch with their friends, old and new.



Mrs Snagg added, "Summer school was an excellent success in terms of attendance and how the students conducted themselves over the course of the week. Staff commented on their eagerness and positivity as well as the great and inquisitive questions they posed. I am delighted to say that this has continued into the start of the new term."



Following the induction ceremony last week students have spent time with their form tutors getting to know the other students in their class, they have had tours around the school building and practiced routines for break, lunch and fire drills. Students received key safeguarding information from the Designated Safeguarding Lead and took part in e-safety, antibullying and wellbeing sessions over the course of their first few days.

They have also already taken part in their first inter-house

competition where the whole year group took to the field to play a carousel of rounders to determine the winning house!



Year 12 students joined the academy Sixth Form on Friday 3rd September 2021 and impressed straight away with their mature attitude to their studies. Students induction to college life started with a welcome assembly from Head of Sixth Form, Mr Fenner. This was followed by ex-students visiting and talking to Year 12 about their experiences and sharing their advice on how to get the most out of their time at Sixth Form. Students also took part in a gym induction and study skill sessions which discussed effective independent study to support learning both at home and in the academy.



Year 12 and 13 students returned this term to see considerable investment made into the Sixth Form provision at OBA with a brand-new study room, independent study booths and group study areas being amongst the biggest changes. Students will now also benefit from an improved café area, gym facilities and

dedicated Sixth Form wing.

Mr Fenner, Head of Sixth Form at OBA said, "We are really excited about the physical changes that have been made to the Sixth Form as we believe students will benefit from the increased freedom this affords. Students benefit from the strong pastoral care and guidance offered by a school Sixth Form whilst now still having the opportunity to experience life as an undergraduate. This year we are seeing our first ever medic students applying to university and it is exciting to watch Year 12 begin the next steps towards their future goals."



Staff at the academy are delighted to welcome Year 7 and Year 12 to the OBA Family and are looking forward to watching them live the school's motto 'Dare to Shine' over the coming months.

London Marathon Triumph for Miss Harding



Miss Harding took on the challenge of the 2021 London Marathon in memory of her sister Kellie who died aged four from a lung related illness. Miss Harding suffers herself with asthma and Bronchiectasis and as a result can struggle with these issues on a daily basis. By completing the marathon, Miss Harding wanted to prove that even if you have a chronic illness, you can still do amazing things.

The training required to compete in the marathon took place over a gruelling 16-week period. During the week, Miss Harding was doing shorter runs and core work, followed by graduating runs on a Sunday that were much longer in length. Despite the training being hard Miss Harding said she kept motivated and focused by the thought of running the marathon and raising much needed funds for the British Lung Foundation.

Miss Harding travelled down to London on the Friday night before the race on the Sunday. She described feeling very nervous and emotional on the day and said it was amazing to hear everyone's story as to why they were running it. Miss Harding said, "I was in wave 15 (meaning my start time was 10:43-46). It was the hardest thing I have ever done, and yet the most amazing. People had lined the streets just to support us and were shouting our names to give us a boost. I was blown away by these strangers standing there for hours to hand us sweets and water.

I hit a metaphorical wall at mile 20, as my body and mind were telling me to stop. All I could think of was everyone who had sponsored me and believed I could do it, and also my mum waiting at the finish line! I definitively believe my sister helped me to reach that finish line."

Miss Harding completed the race in an extremely dignified 5 hours and 26 minutes.

MMA Success as Sophie Achieves Gold!

Ormiston Bolingbroke student Sophie, who is in Year 11, has been busy training and competing in the highly disciplined sport of Mixed Martial Arts (MMA).

MMA is a growing sport, where competitors combine different disciplines that include Brazilian jiu-jitsu (BJJ), judo, karate, boxing, kickboxing, wrestling, and others to their tactical advantage in a competitive arena.

Sophie was just nine years old when she started training in Speke, in Liverpool three times a week but as her aptitude for the sport progressed, so did her resilience and dedication. Sophie is an outstanding example of hard work, as she currently trains from three to six hours per day, every day. Sophie won her MMA fight in June and then had further success in August at the All-Stars BJJ. She also competed in the European championships for BJJ this September, where she won gold.

Sophie, the only England gold medallist for the cadets IMMAF, continues to train for major competitions, with her eyes set on the IMMUE trials and the Ironman that are soon to be taking place at the NEC in Birmingham. 20,000 tickets have already been sold for these highly anticipated events which will help showcase MMA on a major scale and support in the efforts being made to get the sport included in the Olympic Games. After these events, Sophie will then move on to the England trials for the world championships where she will be fighting to retain her world champion 2019 MMA title.

Mr Neil Bellis, Sophie's Father said:

"Sophie's dedication to the sport is truly inspiring. In the run up to these recent competitions, she has been super strict and disciplined in all aspects of training, including her diet. As a family, we are unbelievably proud of her and will continue to support her every step of the way."

"We are extremely proud of Sophie and her recent successes. It is wonderful to hear all about her achievements and myself, the Year 11 team and the whole OBA family wish her all the very best of luck in her up and coming competitions."

Saturday 9th October 2021 saw the launch of our ever popular Around-the-World (ATW) project! The programme which is now in its 10th year is exclusively for Year 6 children and forms a key part of the academy's transition offer.

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Each term time Saturday (9.30am until 1.00pm) the focus is on a different country and children have the chance to make (and taste!) traditional foods as well as taking part in dance, drama and music workshops related to that week's themed country. Arts and Crafts, Cooking, Language lessons, Sports events and lots of trips out are all on the agenda. The Around-the-World (ATW) team consists of Year Six students from several local primary schools.

This means that in addition to children learning a whole range of new and diverse skills - they will also have the chance to meet new people and form new friendships. The aim of the project is to boost confidence and selfesteem, develop social skills and provide exciting opportunities for children to try something new. If students are hoping to join OBA in September 2022 then the ATW project is also a brilliant way to support their transition to the academy. They will have the chance to meet some of our teachers, make friends with people who could also be in their vear group and become familiar with the academy building - all of which can help to ease some of the anxiety caused by starting 'big' school!



57 Year 6 children attended the launch week and enjoyed taking part in a carousel of activities including silhouette art work, archaeology hieroglyphics and testing handmade Roman aqueducts! The morning culminated in a big quiz which involved students matching flags to countries and taste-testing food from around the world to link to the countries identified.

It has been another busy half term with our Lessons for Life programme resuming after the summer break for all students in years 7 to 11. This half term has seen a wide range of projects undertaken by our students as part of their Personal, Social, Health Education.

Our new Year 7 cohort have been learning about community values in their project 'Me and My Community'. This project is focussed on making a positive contribution to the local area and to the school community. As part of our zero-tolerance stance on bullying, Year 8 students have been working on a project entitled 'OBA Against Bullying' which looks at understanding what bullying behaviour is and about the effects

and consequences of unacceptable bullying. Year 9 students have been following an important project on drug, alcohol and tobacco education entitled 'Looking After Myself'. This project was enriched by a guest speaker from the Amy Winehouse Foundation who visited the academy on Thursday 21st October and spoke about her experience of drug and alcohol abuse.



Key Stage 4 Year 10 students have been examining the risks, dangers and signs of grooming in their project 'Snagged' and have looked at a series of short films around different people's experiences of grooming. One of the important topics covered in this project was County Lines. In Year 11 students have been following a project to gear them up for their future by completing 'Me and My Money,' which covers many different practical financial literacy elements such as budgeting, borrowing, payment methods, saving and investing, mortgages, loans, pensions and how money can effect mental wellbeing to name just a few.

A massive well done to all students for their hard work and maturity shown on all their projects within Lessons for Life.

ONLINE SAFETY ISSUES

Ormiston Bolingbroke Academy recognises that the internet is a fantastic resource that brings endless benefits. However, the online world also presents problems and risks which we all need to be aware of. These include:





Content

Being exposed to illegal, inappropriate or harmful content, such as: pornography, fake news, racism, misogyny, self-harm, suicide, anti-Semitism, radicalisation and extremism.



Contact

Being subjected to harmful online interaction with other people; for example: peer pressure, commercial advertising and adults posing as children or young adults with the intention to groom or exploit them for sexual, criminal, financial or other purposes.



Conduct

Everything that you publish and post online creates what is known as your 'Digital Footprint' and stays with you for life. Many people have said and done things online which they later regret. This can affect your reputation and your career.



Commercialism

Young people's enjoyment online can sometimes lead to people unwillingly spending money online, risks include online gambling, inappropriate advertising, phishing and or financial scams.



Cyberbullying

When technology is used to hurt other peoples' feelings without seeing them in person. Cyberbullying can often be more hurtful than face-to-face bullying.



Online Sexual Harassment and Abuse

Young people may experience harassment, sexual abuse, sexual exploitation or emotional abuse online. Such online harassment and abuse can be from people you know, as well as from strangers. People often feel like there is no escape from online abuse and harassment.



Disinformation

Not all the information we see online is true for example 'Fake News' often appears online. You should only ever trust reliable sources.



Radicalisation

Extremist organisations have been known to use the internet to try and encourage young people to share their views and ideologies.



Sexting

When messages and indecent images are sent to/from a young person. This is against the law and can have serious consequences. Sometimes these images can be used in 'revenge porn' acts which is also against the law and can be very upsetting for the victim.



Privacy

Personal details and information are sometimes hacked into by people with bad intentions, for example bank details to steal a person's money.



Catfishing

Pretending to be someone you're not online by posting false information, or using someone else's pictures or name to impersonate them.



Online Pressure

Many people feel pressured online to 'follow the crowd'. This can include getting involved in cyberbullying campaigns and using filters to look different. This often has a negative effect on a young person's self-esteem.



Overuse of Technology

Some young people spend too much time using technology. This often has a negative effect on a person's performance at school, their health and well-being as well as their social life.



Copyright and Privacy

Work shared online is often protected by copyright law and you may be breaking the law if you use other people's work or download content without permission or without paying for this service.
