# **Author Enthralls Students**with Inspiring Visit to OBA









On Friday 9th June, Year 12 students from the OBA Sixth Form visited the UCAS Discovery Exhibition at Liverpool Acc.

The Modern Foreign Languages (MFL) students, who are in Years 8-11, had the chance to see their learning in action as they explored the beautiful Spanish city and its world-famous architecture and landmarks.

On day 1, the group accompanied by 5 members of OBA staff, visited the notorious marketplace Las Ramblas and explored the city on foot in the sunshine while making a stop off at Casa Milà popularly known as La pedara.

Day 2 involved spending a whole day at the famous Portaventura theme park where students enjoyed the waterslides, a free fall tower and for the more daring ones - some of the highest and fastest rollercoasters in Europe!



On day 3, the group visited the most beautiful monument of the city called La Sagrada Familia


















## Daresbury Laboratory Trip

Sixth Form biology students recently had the chance to spend the day at Daresbury Laboratory.

During the trip on Monday 10th July, A Level students went on a guided tour of the facilities, where they were able to gain a greater understanding of the innovative world leading work being carried out. They were shown the particle collider and found out both how it works and what it is being used for. They saw the areas where some leading technology in particle acceleration, for around the world, is being made. The students also got to get involved in demonstrations using magnets and superconductors to see how transport may be revolutionised in the future and programme robots to detect water in environments that are to hostile for humans. A particular highlight for students was being able to eat ice cream that was made in minutes using the cooling properties of liquid nitrogen!

Mrs Perchard, Science teacher at OBA, said "Overall, it was a fantastic day that will inspire the students and let them know about the amazing careers that are available in our local area, as well as seeing how the work we do in lessons can be used in the careers of the future."

# Lessons for Life update:



The final half term has been yet again a busy period for our PSHE curriculum.

This half term year 7 students have been learning about their local community which includes the history, geography and democratic make up of our local area. In their final Lessons for Life session before summer, year 7 had a guest presenter visit school to discuss the important topic of road safety.

In year 8, students have been covering a newly introduced project named 'relationships and identity' learning about issues such as healthy relationships, different genders, identities and sexualities and also about the important topic of sexting.

In year 9, as part of our Relationship and Sex Education curriculum, students have been following up from their school nurse visits where they learned about sexual health and contraception with a booklet based project around this.

In addition to the above PSHE projects, all students in Key Stage 3 have completed a lesson about water safety. We purposely time this lesson to take place before the summer holidays when young people may be tempted to swim in open water.

Our year 10 students have been learning about employability this half term. This is timed to tie in with their work experience

placements and involved a pre work experience lesson looking at workplace skills and behaviours. After completing their work experience, students have reflectd on the employability skills they have learned and developed in the workplace. We have also had two exciting and informative visits from current university students from our partners at Shaping Futures. These sessions looked at post 16 pathways and also Labour Market Information for our local and regional area. We are very thankful for our visitors who have given up their time to enrich and enhance our students' PSHE curriculum.



- Never leave kids unsupervised near

  ANY body of water, and ALWAYS ensure there's a Water Watcher on duty.
- Remind children they're NOT to go near any body of water without permission from an adult.
- DO NOT rely on water wings or any other inflatable flotation device to save a child in a water emergency.
- Have children wear a properly-fitting life jacket if needed.
- DO NOT allow your children to engage in any horseplay, breath-holding games or dunking in the water.
- Only swim in designated areas with a lifeguard present, and avoid areas with high waves or rip currents.
- Adhere to all posted rules, warnings and flags, which may indicate the presence of unsafe swimming conditions or deep water.
- Enter the water feet first DO NOT dive in!
- Always swim with a buddy, who can signal for help if you need it.
