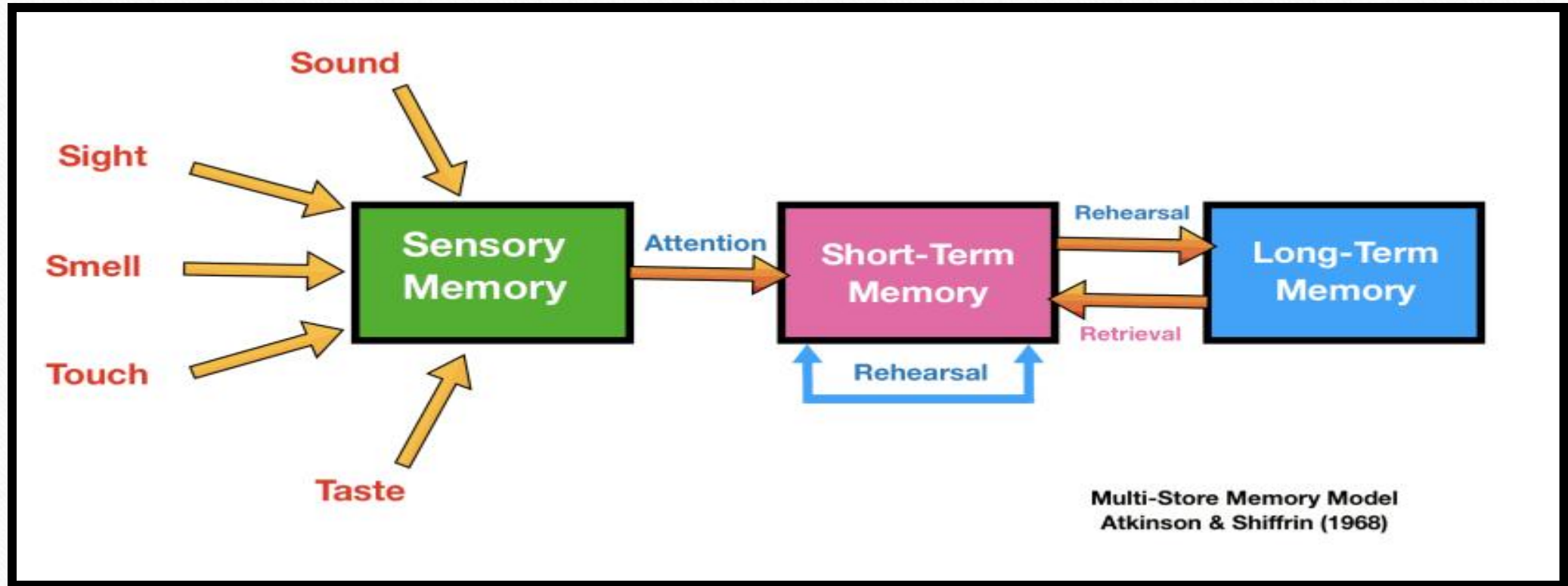


# How Memory Works?


# Using Flash Cards

- 3) No more than 3 max on the information side.

- History: Figures + Facts / Event Name + Description
- Science: Keyword + Definition / Formula + How it works
- Maths: Practice question + Answer / Formula + How it works
- Psychology: Research Method + How it works / Case Study + Evidence
