ATTENDANCE WHY IT MATTERS

Persistent absence means pupils who miss more than 10% of school every year.

For each additional day of

absence between years 7 to 11, the typical pupil could miss out on an average of **£750** in future lifetime earnings

This rises to almost £20k less on average at age 28 for those who are severely absent

year 10 and 11 could earn

£10,000 less on average at

age 28, compared to pupils

with near perfect attendance









OAT'S GOT TALENT...AT OBA!

A big thanks must also go to our Head of Sixth Form, **Mr Fenner**, who organised the event.
















DANCE SHOW NUMBER 4!
